

NBCI Is Seeking to Help Newly Diagnosed Lung Cancer Patients Who Are Members of Our Churches



GI Therapeutics is enrolling patients in two studies for patients with extensive-stage SCLC to determine the potential benefit of G1T28 in addition to chemotherapy. These studies are investigating the potential clinical benefit of GIT28 in protecting bone marrow and preserving the immune system when administered prior to chemotherapy.

The first study (GIT28-02) is for newly diagnosed patients who have not yet received chemotherapy. The second study (GIT28-03) is for previously treated patients whose tumors have progressed (relapsed). In both studies, patients will receive either GIT28 or a placebo along with chemotherapy.

All patients will receive the standard of care chemotherapy. Treatment cycles will occur without interruption, except when necessary to manage potential 'sid'e-effects or for administrative reasons (e.g., out of town). A delay of up to 2 weeks is permitted to allow recovery from any side-effects.

Potential benefits of GIT28

- Protect bone marrow and preserve the immune system during chemotherapy
- Potential to significantly improve anti-tumor responses and patient outcomes by:
 - Enabling planned chemotherapy regimens and preserving immune system function
 - Reducing infections, bleeding, hospitalizations, transfusions, and growth-factor usage

G1 is currently recruiting patients for two Phase 1b/2a trials in SCLC

- First line extensive stage SCLC
- Multi-center, randomized
- Carboplatin and etoposide + GIT28
