National Black Church Initiative Authorized 25,000 Volunteers To Help Keep The Peace in 25 Cities in Light of the Death of George Floyd

The Church swings into action to help stop the violence

Washington DC — The National Black Church Initiative (NBCI), a coalition of 34,000 churches representing 27.7 million African Americans are joining with over 150,000 faith communities across the country to activate over 25,000 peace volunteers in 25 cities to help stop the violence in light of the deaths of African Americans by the police. Rev. Anthony Evans authorized its minister to put over 500 peace volunteers on the streets in their cities to help law enforcement reduce violence.

We were moved to do this to help those communities out. And after speaking with state leaders and my ministers around the country and then I decided this action. I hope and prayer that its works”

This is the third time in recent years Rev. Evans felt to need to authorized these many volunteers. The volunteers are called upon to perform three task-1) encourage a peaceful display of the purpose of the marches 2) educate and encourage others to do so by using the word of God. 3) to work with law enforcement and team leaders to help reduce the violence in any form.
